





In addition to the 349 seater Main Auditorium, The Studio is an intimate and flexible black box space with a theatre style capacity of 55. A further six meeting rooms are available for conferencing, meetings, and workshops, ranging in size and capacity. All conference rooms come with AV equipment, air conditioning and support from a dedicated commercial team.



The rooms are available to hire at a competitive rate for evening rehearsals, special occasions, workshops, and classes.
